Scrappy Sunflower Runner

Slow down, relax, and use your fabric stash to create a scrappy sunflower using English Paper Piecing stretched pentagons plus a decagon! Michele will teach you how to sew them together with a flatback stitch; how to hand applique them to the runner centers; how to machine "stitch in the ditch"; and to complete this 14 ¹/₂" x 34 ¹/₂" runner!

* Please note that this is a FUN, stress free technique class; and the project will not be finished in class.

Skill level: Advanced Beginner - Intermediate

* This class *is not* for EPP beginners, and those attending need to have EPP experience.

* You must know how to accurately measure; use a rotary cutter; and know how to sew an accurate 1/4" seam on your sewing machine.

Kit includes: Ten stretched pentagons and one decagon EPP paper templates plus the quilt pattern

Kit cost: \$10 plus shipping

<u>Materials List</u> * *Please choose whatever fabrics and colors you desire!*

For the Stretched Pentagons and Decagons

Thirty 2 ³/₄" x 2 ³/₄" assorted yellow fabrics

Three 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares of brown fabric

~ Hand sewing needle that is comfortable for you

~ Small spool of cotton thread for basting (any color)

- ~ Water soluble *fabric* glue stick
- ~ 1" x 6" ruler
- ~ Paper tape medium (I recommend Nexcare by 3M at Target)
- ~ *If needed or desired*: 3 mini Wonder clips; a thimble; portable light; magnifying glass; and/or bifocals.

To Complete the Quilt

- ~ 1/3 yard of fabric (block centers) * Sample used Osnaburg (a type of muslin)
- ~ 1/8 yard of fabric (frame border)
- ~ 1/8 yard of fabric (outer border)
- ~ Forty-eight 2" x 2 ¹/₂" strips of assorted fabrics (binding)
- ~ 19" x 39" piece of fabric (quilt back)
- ~ 19" x 39" piece of cotton batting
- ~ Sewing thread
- ~ Rotary cutter, ruler and cutting mat
- ~ Basic sewing supplies
- \sim Sewing machine with an accurate 1/4" foot
