There is so much more to English Paper Piecing (EPP) than hexagons! Learning how to create, and hand sew curved EPP shapes together with *practice* will open a whole new world! Michele will teach you her technique on how to create the infamous Clam Shell, and how to sew them together to make a 12 ½" square scrappy pillow top.

* Please note that this is a FUN, stress free technique class; and the project will not be finished in class.

Skill level: Advanced Beginner > Intermediate (for EPP)

* This class *is not* for EPP beginners, and those attending need to have EPP experience.

Kit includes: Twenty 2" EPP clamshell paper templates; and the Clamshell pillow pattern.

Kit cost: \$10 plus shipping

Materials List for the EPP Clamshells

- ~ Hand sewing needle that is comfortable for you
- ~ Small spool of cotton thread for basting (any color)
- ~ Water soluble *fabric* glue stick
- ~ 1" x 6" acrylic ruler
- ~ Paper tape medium (I recommend Nexcare by 3M at Target)
- ~ *If needed or desired*: 3 mini Wonder clips; a thimble; portable light; magnifying glass; and/or bifocals.

To complete the Pillow

- ~ Eighty-five 3" assorted squares of fabric (* a true fabric stash bustin' project)
- $\sim 12 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric square (pillow back)
- ~ 18" x 18" square of muslin
- ~ 12" x 12" square pillow form
- ~ Sewing thread to match and/or coordinate with the fabric
- ~ Micron 01 permanent black pen
- ~ 3" x 3" square of white paper
- ~ Acrylic ruler (3" x 12", 4" x 14" OR 6" x 24")
- ~ Rotary cutter
- \sim Cutting mat (*small one 7" x 7" if possible)
- ~ Basic sewing supplies
