

Make a Color POP Quilt

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Class Description

Pick a color and use free-form/improvisational piecing to create a small quilt top. Then slash through it to add a pop of color. Learn and use free-piecing techniques for straight line and easy curved seams.

Student supply List

Fabric

- At least 10 fat-eighths (or large scraps) of mostly light to medium-value fabrics of 1 color (blue, red, yellow, etc.)—hand-dyes, tone-on-tones, and very subtle prints work best
- ¼ yard (fat or regular) of a contrasting color for the pop

Other Tools and Supplies

- Sewing machine in good working order
- Your usual sewing tools (seam ripper, thread snips, etc., whatever you like to have on hand)
- Rotary cutter, mat, and ruler
- Sewing thread to match your chosen fabric color
- Design wall or flannel/batting to use as a design wall. about 36" x 40" or so
- Straight pins (glass-head extra-fine pins recommended, such as silk .5 mm size)
