

Backgrounds, Fills and Edge to Edge Designs with Westalee Rulers supply list – with Adele Scott

We'll create designs using our **Westalee Basic Sampler** set, some **Straight** line work, **Mini Fills** and other optional rulers. We'll discuss the tips and tricks for these quilting options that take a quilt beyond the ordinary. The contrast of textures and the variety of pattern gives so much more personality to your quilting than a stipple or meander stitch. [And with rulers is so much easier!]

Supply List: sewing machine set-up for Ruler Work - **threaded, full bobbin and in good working condition**

6 - "fat-quarter" fabric sandwiches [for **top fabric a more solid, darker fabric is easier to see** your ruler lines, typical cotton batting, and backing any cotton print]

Westalee Sampler Set

Westalee Mini Fill set or single

Westalee Border Set or Honeycomb template [or other appropriate ruler, check with me first]

markers that show on your fabric top

Crosshair 8 point - either size

optional - DM Marking Tool - either size

G-Easy ruler stickers or colored tape or a fine sharpie to mark rulers

General sewing supplies – a regular, **long quilting ruler** to draw lines

Prep: make sure rulers have something to prevent slipping like Stable Tape or Grippy

To simulate an applique either prepare a sample of an applique or do a quilting design in the center of a square then add one border to frame **or** find an "orphan" block **or** use an unfinished project **or** on one of your fat quarter sandwiches draw a square, sew a quilting medallion design then draw the "seam" to outline the block.
