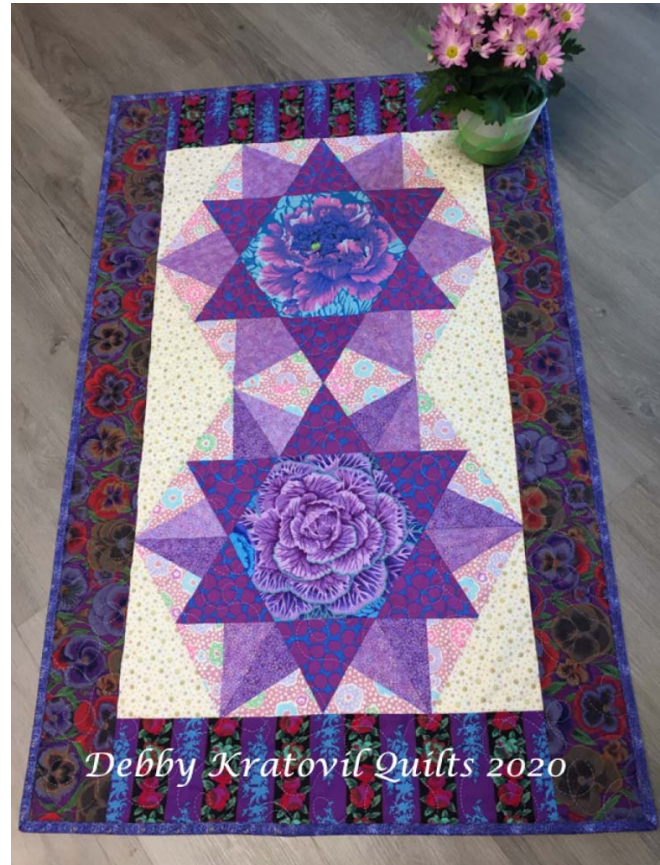

Center a beautiful motif in the middle of this amazing block. Use freezer paper (explained in class) to capture exactly what you want to feature.

Go bigger and make a 4 block quilt! Or even just a two block runner.

No y-seams!



Block Size: 16" x 18"
Quilt Size: 28" x 42"



Supplies for EACH of these 3 quilts is listed inside, along with a planning sheet for arranging your colors.

Four Block Quilt: 42" x 47"
Block Size: 16" x 18"

Single Block Table Topper (16" x 18")

- A - One 8-1/2" x 10" rectangle. If you want to fussy cut this center hexagon, center your motif inside the rectangle.
- B - One 4-1/2" x wof strip.
- C - 2 strips EACH of two colors, cut 3" x wof.
- This block is NOT squared up on the sides (it finishes to a hexagon), so you don't need Patch D.
- Binding: 1/4 yard

Two Block Table Runner or Wall Banner (26" x 41")

- A - Two 8-1/2" x 10" rectangles OR a strip cut 8-1/2" x wof. If you want to fussy cut this center hexagon, center your motif inside the rectangle.
- B - Two 4-1/2" x wof strips. One may be enough, but you don't want to be short if you make a bad cut!
- C - Three strips EACH of two colors, cut 3" x wof.
- D - One strip cut 8-1/2" x wof.
- Border Fabric: 1/2 yard
- Binding: 1/3 yard

Four Block Quilt (42" x 47")

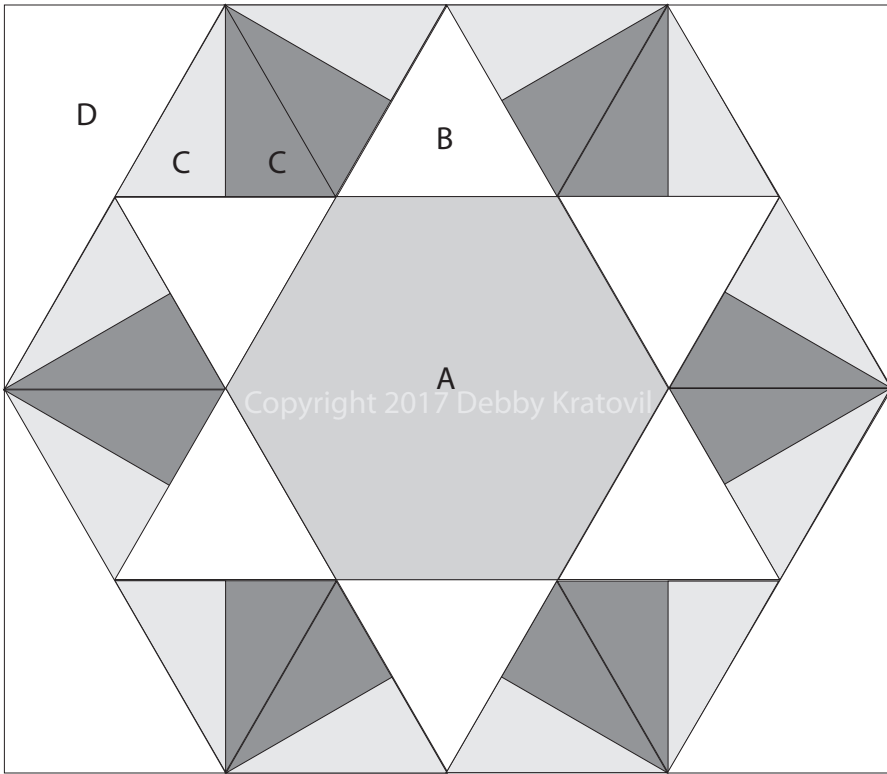
- A - Four 8-1/2" x 10" rectangles OR a strip cut 8-1/2" x wof. If you want to fussy cut this center hexagon, center your motif inside the rectangle.
- B - One 4-1/2" strip for EACH block for the scrappy look or three strips if you want a single color for these triangles. (2 strips may be enough, but you can't afford a cutting mistake!)
- C - Six 3" x wof strips EACH of two colors.
- D - Two different fat quarters for the quilt as I have it OR one 8-1/2" x wof strip if using a single fabric
- Border Fabrics: 1/4 yard inner border; 1-1/2 yards outer border and binding.

****I STRONGLY recommend a multi-sized 60 degree triangle ruler with at least an 8-1/2" height (Creative Grids, Fons & Porter). They MUST have a blunted tip!! I will have paper templates with the pattern for those who prefer that method.

****For those who want to fussy cut a motif (ie, center it in the middle of the large hexagon), you will need a piece of freezer paper cut 8-1/2" x 10". Questions? Email me: Kratovil@his.com

****We will be cutting ALL shapes using the 60 degree triangle ruler. I suggest you have some construction paper to practice on. Cut a strip (or two) 8-1/2" x 11-12"; a strip 8-1/2" x 11-12"; a strip 4-1/2" x 11-12". This way, if you make a mistake, it's only paper you throw out!

Double Hexie Star© Planning Sheet

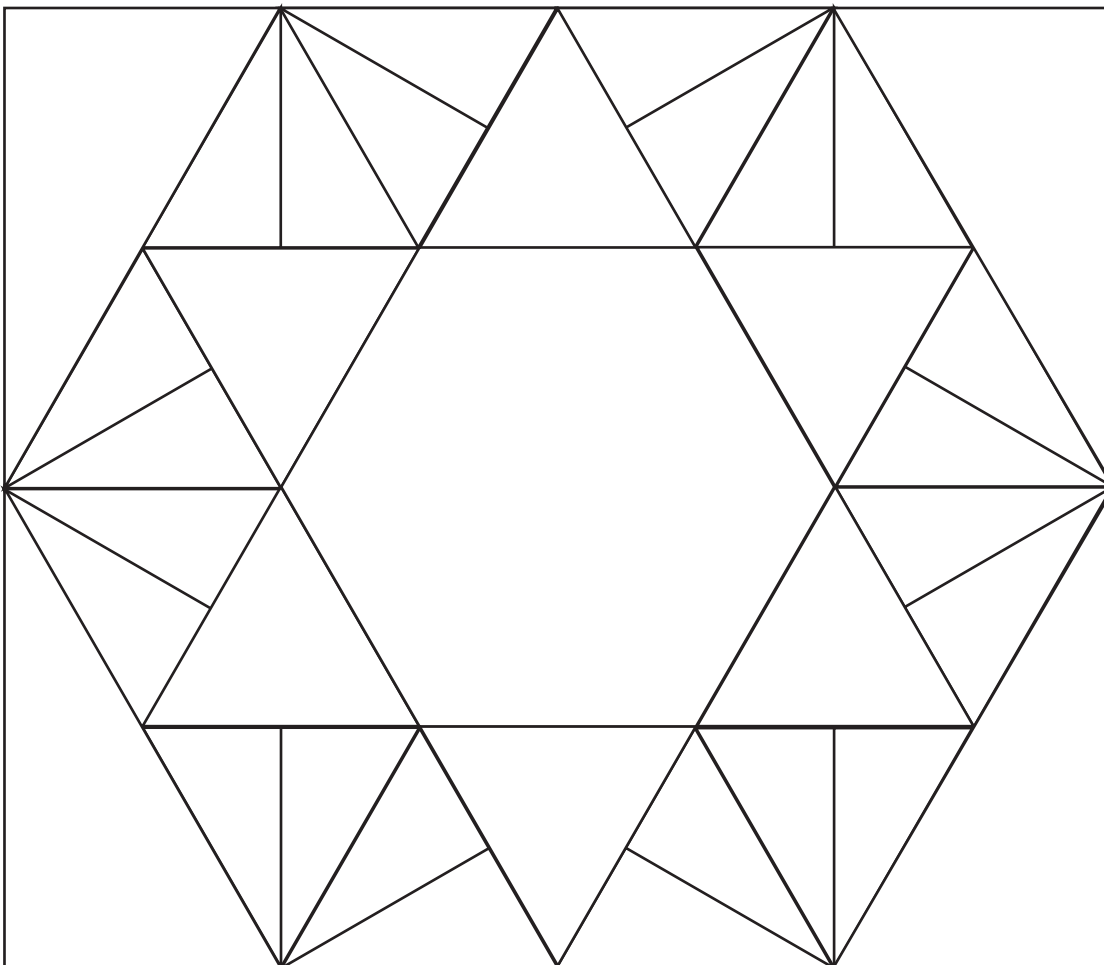
