

# Red-Eyed Tree Frog Fabric Collage

## Material List Jane Haworth

You may use my sample as inspiration or choose your own colorway

Selection of fabrics to suit your pattern. More variety of fabrics makes collage easier.

Colors: Light and dark gray for the branch, Greens in light, medium and dark for the frog and leaves, Tan or beige for frog body, orange, yellow, brown for the frogs legs. Small pieces red, white and black for the eyes.

These can be small pieces 4-12". I use a variety of plains, hand-dyes, batiks, small prints, tone-on-tone, texture prints, kaffes etc.

~ Approx. 1/2 yd piece of Pellon foundation: Easy Pattern, Tru Grid or similar. You need to be able to see through it.

This acts as a stabilizer that the collage is glued to during the process.

~ Scissors, sharp and good for cutting small pieces of fabric. I like Karen Kay Buckley Perfect 6" scissors.

~ Pencil & Chalk marking tool or similar, disappearing pen. I like the Bohin chalk pencil (red one)

~ Fabric glue, I use Aleenes Tacky Glue. You can use school glue, or other fabric glues like Roxannes Basting Glue.

~ Small container for glue and Tool for applying glue like a toothpick or similar. (I use a school glue spreader.)

~ Optional: Tweezers Light box, Parchment paper or clear pressing sheet.
