Description:	Learn my unique paper piecing technique to get super sharp points for your block. We will also learn piecing curves to finish the blocks.
Time	6 hour class

SUPPLY LIST	
<input type="checkbox"/>	<b>FABRICS:</b>
	<p>This quilt is a four block sampler. Each block measures approximately 8-12 inches. If you choose to make the quilt larger you will need more fabrics but we will concentrate on technique so you will not need to bring tons of fabric to class – try to control yourself so you don't get too distracting playing with fabrics during class.</p> <p>I don't recommend you purchase or bring any sashing or border fabrics to class unless you are looking for advice – I don't believe those fabrics should not be chosen until all the blocks are complete so that they can help you decide what fabrics to use for the sashings and borders.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	Eight Fat Quarters for the backgrounds and centers of the four blocks. Coordinate your fabrics, avoid true solids, include small and medium designs – be creative, don't get to "matchy-matchy".
<input type="checkbox"/>	Coordinating fabrics – a combination of dark, medium and lights so that you can see contrasts. FQ's or scraps will work – I would recommend no scraps smaller than 5"x18" for the points. avoid true solids, include small and medium designs – stripes are fun to use for some of your fabrics.
	<b>BASIC SUPPLIES:</b>
<input type="checkbox"/>	Rotary cutter, 28mm or 45mm size – no larger
<input type="checkbox"/>	Rotary mat: small 9"x12" for use on the table to the left of your sewing machine. Mat 18" x 24" recommended for squaring up your blocks – we can share with others this mat.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Rulers: 6" or 12" Add a Quarter" ruler by CM Designs – you should be able to find this at your local quilt shop or at <a href="http://www.cmdesignsonline.com">www.cmdesignsonline.com</a>
	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Sewing machine in good working order
<input type="checkbox"/>	100% Cotton 50 Weight piecing thread – neutral color that would coordinate with your chosen fabrics.
<input type="checkbox"/>	New Sewing machine needle – Size 70 Microtex for piecing
<input type="checkbox"/>	Fabric Marking tools that you can see on your chosen fabrics.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Straight pins – I recommend the Clover Silk glass ball head pins.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Spray Sizing – Mary Ellen's Best Press (no spray starch)

- Personal small iron and holder that you trust. I love the Clover Mini Iron and a large mug to put it in when not in use.
