<input type="checkbox"/>	FABRICS:	
	¾ yards fabric for Setting Triangles. I recommend you start with a stripe multi-color fabric for the Setting Triangles and choose fabrics to coordinate to create the rest of this quilt. The stripe is not required but I would love to show you how fun they are to use.	
<input type="checkbox"/>	½ of a yard of different fabrics for your 9-patch units, setting squares and border corners.	
<input type="checkbox"/>	1 Yard of the fabric for the border and binding, although we probably won't get to the point where you will actually need this.	
<input type="checkbox"/>	We will not get to the backing and batting but when you are ready for that you will need 3 yards for the backing (I would suggest a fabrics with a small busy multi-color print) and a batting that is 48" square.	

BASIC SUPPLIES:

BECAUSE THIS IS A CLASS ON LEARNING BASICS I AM INCLUDING THE BRANDS AND ITEMS THAT I THINK ARE THE BEST TO BE HAD. IF YOU HAVE A FAVORITE AND IT WORKS FOR YOU, WE CAN MAKE IT WORK ☺

<input type="checkbox"/>	Rotary cutter, 45mm or 60mm size –I prefer the Olfa Ergonomic style and brand	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Rotary mat: Mat 18" x 24" recommended – please bring your own, no sharing ☺ My preferred brand is Olfa, the green mats.	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Ruler – a square that is at least 9½" – if you have one larger that is fine. My preferred brand is Omnigrid	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Ruler – 6"x24", or 6½" or 8½" wide – my preferred brand is Omnigrid.	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Sewing machine in good working order – only bring a small "class" machine if you are very comfortable using it – I recommend you bring that machine you do most of your piecing on so you feel confident while working.	
<input type="checkbox"/>	100% Cotton 50 Weight piecing thread – neutral color – this is not a good time to bring old threads from your Grandmothers sewing box. 100% cotton in a 50 weight is the only choice ☺ - there are many really good brands of 100% cotton to choose from	
<input type="checkbox"/>	New Sewing machine needle – Size 70 Microtex for piecing – I like the Schmetz brand	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Straight pins – I recommend the Clover Silk glass ball head pins.	

<input type="checkbox"/> Seam Guilds from Guidelines4Quilters. I love these things and I don't even know the manufacturer ☺ - these are the perfect tool for making the perfect scant 1/4" seam allowance.	 <p style="text-align: center;">OR</p>
<input type="checkbox"/> Spray Sizing – Mary Ellen's Best Press or the brand at the grocery store but <u>no</u> spray starch	
<input type="checkbox"/> Marking tool that you can see on your border fabric. I recommend a white mechanical pencil – there are many brands to choose from.	
<input type="checkbox"/> Good quality seam ripper (I love the Clover large white handle one)	
<input type="checkbox"/> Glow Tape for your ruler,	
<input type="checkbox"/> Measuring tape – 60" will work, but a 120" is what you will need for larger quilts so if you are purchasing new I would recommend a 120".
