

Sewing Machines for this class are provided by Brother and Moore's Sewing Center.

The following supply list may state that you need to bring your own sewing machine. **THIS IS NOT CORRECT.** *Please do not bring your own sewing machine to this class.*





Northern Neighbours

A truly spectacular scrap quilt that can be made in one of three sizes. You can choose to make just one block and frame it for a pretty wall quilt or keep going to produce either a twin or king size quilt. In class, we'll be working on making just the one block wall quilt. Additional yardage for the two larger projects can be located on our website, **Studio180Design.**net. Simply search for the Northern Neighbours pattern to locate fabric information on the back cover page.

The original leaf design uses four of my tools to produce the points and stem of each leaf:

- Corner Beam[®]
- Split Rects[®]
- Tucker Trimmer® I
- Wing Clipper[®] I

The Wing Clipper® I tool must be purchased and brought with you to class. The other tools can be borrowed during class time to make the few units required for the wall quilt project. It's a great opportunity to "try before you buy".

Additionally, you may choose to either purchase a precut kit (for the wall hanging size only) or use your own fabrics if you intend to make one of the larger project options.

To purchase a kit, you must notify me at least 30 days prior to class. Cost is \$40 and is payable in class by check or cash *only*!

It will include precut leaves, background, outer border, and binding fabric. It will not include the dark inner border to allow you to personalize your quilt.

If you are not purchasing a kit, you must come with your leaf fabrics and background fabrics precut and ready for construction. These will be simple squares and rectangles that will then be subcut using either your own or the borrowed Corner Beam* and Split Rects* tools.

Equipment and Supplies

Required Tools:

- Wing Clipper[®] I Tool*
- Sewing Machine in good working order unless you are in a machine sponsored class.
 Please check with your event coordinator.
- Neutral Colored Thread tan or gray
- Rotary Cutter new blade recommended
- Small Cutting Mat
- Regular Cutting Rulers 6" x 12"
- Marking Tools fine line marker such as Pigma™, Frixion™, or mechanical pencil
- Favorite Pressing Agent Best Press, sizing, or the like
- Basic Sewing Supplies scissors, seam ripper, pins, etc.

Highly Recommended Tools:

- Tucker Trimmer[®] I Tool*
- Quilter's Magic Wand™ Tool*
- Corner Beam® Tool*
- Split Rects[®] Tool*

Yardage and Precutting Instructions

If you plan to work from your stash, please consider this tip. Create your four leaves in four different color families. For example, use a variety of green fabrics for one leaf and then a variety of red fabrics for the next leaf and so on. This strategy will help unify your project and keep all those "scraps" under control. Also when I list "dark" it means your medium to dark colored fabric. When I list "light", it means your light background fabric. Complete cutting directions for the twin and king size projects are in the pattern. Everyone will need the pattern for the construction steps. Below are the precutting instructions for all attendees. Remember, if you would like a fabric kit, please notify me within 30 days of your scheduled workshop. They will be available in class with a cash and carry payment of \$40.00.

Wall Hanging Yardage Requirements:

Fabric	Yardage
Light Background	% yard
Multicolored Border	% yard
Scraps	To Total % yard

Light Background

Cutting for the entire four block wall hanging.

Do not quadruple these amounts, as you will for the dark leaf pieces!

Blocks:

1 strip 4" x wof, to sub-cut with the
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Split Rects[®] and Corner Beam[®] tools

Units C* 7 squares* 434" x 434" Units D 4 squares 4" x 4" Units F 16 squares 2" x 2"

Setting pieces:

Center Square 1 square 4" x 4"

Border Fabrics

Note: You may want to wait to cut these until after your center block is complete for more accurate fitting. The listed sizes are exact measurments, but yours may vary slightly.


From inner border fabric:

Cut 2 strips 2" x 23" Cut 2 strips 2" x 26"

From Outer Border fabric:

Cut 2 strips 3½" x 26" Cut 2 strips 3½" x 32"

Use remaining fabric for binding.





Dark Scraps

For each leaf you will need the following pieces. Mix and match various different fabrics from one color family for each leaf.

Repeat the cutting 4 times to make 4 different leaves.

Use the diagram to help choose various print positions in your blocks.

Unit A	1 square 4" x 4"
Unit B	2 rectangles 3" x 4"
Unit C*	4 squares 2¾" x 2¾" *
Unit D	1 strip 1¼" x 5½"
Unit E	2 squares 3½" x 3½"
Unit F	4 squares 2" x 2" **
Center Square	2 squares 3½" x 3½"
Unit C "Geese Rows"	24 squares 2¾" x 2¾" ***

*This number is slightly larger than the square size listed in the pattern, since we will be working with the "No Nudge" method for making our Fast Flying Geese.

**Note that I generally do 2 squares with one fabric print and 2 squares with a different fabric print. It's a scrap quilt after all!

***Either scrappy or all from you multicolored outer border fabric.
