Sewing Machines for this class are provided by Viking & OC Sewing & Vacuum.


Due to safety concerns and contractual obligations, you are NOT permitted to use any machine other than the machines provided by OC Sewing & Vacuum.

Thread Painting 101: Hibiscus

Thread-painting gives you the freedom to make a very realistic image entirely with thread! We will start with pencil-and-paper exercises to study line direction and color changes, and a few warm-up machine exercises in free-motion straight stitch and zig zag. These skills in hand, you will then thread-paint a glorious Hibiscus. Don't worry if the leaves look too detailed to do: you can also do a much faster color-wash background. So you can spend all your time in class learning, your (required, \$25) kit includes a two prepared $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" thread painting sandwiches, one for practice and one for the Hibiscus, as well as detailed directions for making and finishing the Hibiscus. You'll be amazed what you can do!

Thread Painting 101: Hibiscus

You will need:

50 weight thread. A wide range of colors, including both light and dark shades. (I use Aurifil, but any 50 weight cotton- like thread will work.)

For Hibiscus, I recommend 1-2 light blues, dark and medium dark bluegreen, greenish-brown, olive green, medium green, clear yellow, yelloworange, bright orange, scarlet, lavender, maroon/deep dark red, or the colors you see as you study the original photo.

Sewing machine in good working order, capable of dropping its feed dogs, with freemotion embroidery foot attached (I use Bernina's foot #24; it is "C"-shaped, with the opening in front, so you can see clearly where the next stitch will land)

package of size 14 Topstitch needles to fit your sewing machine (I will bring extra)

5-7 Bobbins, loaded with light, medium, and dark neutral color 50-wt thread

5 (approx.) Q-tips (to clean lint from your sewing machine during the workshop)

Iron & ironing surface

I will also bring a roll of parchment paper to protect irons, for the class to share.

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
