Coneflower Cushion Material Requirements

Hi everyone! I'm looking forward to meeting you at Road to California in January.

The appliqué in this class is done entirely by hand, there are no machines. Depending on how quickly you work, you will get around one flower completed in class.

There is a kit fee for this class! Please bring the kit fee with you to class in cash.

The kit contains:

The pattern for the cushion, pre-laminated templates for the appliqué, milliners needles #10, a small bottle of glue and a silver gel pen. The kit is \$45.

I can also bring the other notion supplies for you if requested - I need to know two weeks before class. I will have some spares but I can't guarantee that there will be enough for everyone, so please do let me know if you want something.

Hera Marker - \$10

Sarah Fielke Aurifil Everyday Appliqué 80 weight thread collection - 12 threads \$185

Green pre-made fusible bias tape - \$20 per 11 yard roll

Sandpaper board - \$18

Material Requirements

Things you will need on hand for class:

- Fabric for your cushion background, pre-cut to 13" x 21"
- Five squares 4" approximately for the Coneflower petals (you don't need to cut these perfectly, its just an estimate of how much you need)
- Five squares 3" approximately for Coneflower tops (you don't need to cut these perfectly, its just an estimate of how much you need)
- Fat 16th for leaves
- About a 15" square for making bias tape
- A Hera Marker
- A short patchwork ruler and a small mat if you have one, and a rotary cutter

- 50 or 80 weight cotton thread to match or blend with your fabrics. 100% cotton thread on the finer side will also give you a much better result in your stitches and you will have a much more enjoyable time stitching!!
- A sandpaper board for tracing your pieces accurately
- Scissors for paper and fabric
- Small, sharp, pointed scissors for cutting into appliqué points
- Block book. This is not essential but it's very helpful - it will take a while to make all your plates if you are making the quilt. Every time I start a new quilt at home, I allocate the project its own block book. All the pieces for that quilt live inside the book until I am done, making sure they are safe, flat and together until I'm ready to use them. If you would like to make a block book, when you receive these material requirements please email me sarah@sarahfielke.com, say hello and I will send you the block book pattern via PDF as a gift for taking my class. It's NOT compulsory, just nice to have. Give yourself a few weeks before class if you can so you have time to make one! They're very quick to make and very useful.

Before class please pre-cut your background fabric, it will be much easier for you to get started.
