REQUIREMENT LIST

Rotary Cutter, Cutting mat, patchwork ruler about 12 1/2 inch long (it doesn't need to be square)

Pins

Unpicker

Your usual sewing kit

Fabric scissors, a small pair can be useful as well if you have them

AND Paper scissors

HB or B pencil and something to sharpen it with

Coloured pencils or Textas - a good selection

A fine black marker or Sharpie

Eraser

Whiteout or correction fluid

One A4 sheet of unlined paper (computer or photocopy is fine)

One A4 piece of coloured paper or coloured light card for your templates – colours don't get lost

Thread – cotton - I like medium gray, smoky purple or olive greens as they disappear with many colours Don't bring white or light grey unless you are working with a light background

Small Portable design wall –. Pale flannel or a plastic tablecloth with a fluffy backing is fine

Camera – the one on your phone will do

Small notebook and pen

Fabric

I am a scrap quilter and like to draw from my large stash so fabric requirements are always hard for me.

I suggest you bring a fat quarter of each fabric you select. You might use only a few triangles of some of these but they will go towards the rest of your quilt.

Choose **three colours** you would like to use in one Christmas decoration.

To make sure you have at least **eight different fabrics** you could bring a light, medium and dark in each colour. Although we are making a Christmas quilt the pieces are quite small and rich tone on tones or batiks usually work better than fussy prints.

A printed fabric works well as a feature piece or a centre piece.

Also **choose a background colour and bring three different but similar fabrics in this colour**. My background was the deep blues of a night sky but your quilt would look beautiful with the multiple greens of a Christmas tree, or a simple white background.
